## Zoom Talk Duchess of Windsors Jewels.



There was a good response to the zoom talk organised by PALS about the Duchess of Windsor and her jewels. The talk was presented by Janie Ramsay, who was a director of Sotheby's auction house prior to her retirement and was working there when they held the icon sale of these jewels. Janie had done extensive research in the royal archives to find out many interesting pieces of information not generally known and the talk was most interesting. The sale took place in April 1987 raising 31 million pounds for the Pasteur Institute which is a hospital and research centre located in Paris, France. The jewellery was simply fabulous. The picture shows Cartier flamingo brooch which was the stunning commissioned by the Duke of Windsor for the Duchess in 1940 as a birthday gift, composed of diamonds, emeralds, rubies, sapphires and citrine. Some of the jewellery is now owned by the likes of Madonna, Shirley Bassey, and Joan Collins. As well as the individual members who linked in, Great Chart & Godinton WI held their birthday meeting with us - happy 102nd birthday ladies! Mary Telford, Chairman of PALS gave the vote of thanks to Janie.
