A WORD FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

As you will see in the magazine, your Board of Trustees and the Federation sub-committees are looking ahead and planning various events and outings for members to enjoy next year, these include some at weekends and in the evenings to cater for those who are unable to take part during the day and we hope that you will be able to support them. Indeed, I thoroughly enjoyed the recent evening Zoom talk about the antiques trade from the comfort of my armchair!



You will see the information about the last competition of the year in this issue, please do consider entering to earn points for yourself and your WI – the cups will be awarded at the ACM in March; the lead is currently shared between Broadstairs, Chartham and Sandwich WI's so come along everyone, get those creative juices flowing.

Please keep sending the photos to the editor, it is so good to see the many varied activities that are taking place in our WIs.

As you are all aware, following the success of 'Not the East Kent News' during lockdown and the subsequent problems with the printers, it was decided to trial sending members the East Kent News digitally. Thanks to the hard work of our Federation Secretary, June ably assisted by Alison, the magazine is now delivered to 2760 members electronically.

The Board of Trustees has discussed the trial, taking into account comments received from members, and has concluded that we will continue with the digital version from now on. It will, of course, still be possible for members unable to receive the digital version to purchase a hard copy from the office. We have taken this decision because: -

- The digital version is sent to all members able to receive it on the first of the month – or the first working day thereafter (ordered hard copies are also despatched then). This means that **all** members receive their magazine at the beginning of the month rather than having to wait for a meeting which could be at the end of the month.
- Copy can be accepted close to publication date whereas previously copy had to be sent to the printer three weeks prior to printing, information is now more up to date.
- The printer was charging £320 to deliver a minimum of 3500 copies which is many more than we need, especially as not all WIs purchased additional copies, therefore a lot were thrown away.
- The printer was not able to return to printing our magazine as it was not cost effective for them.
- A local printer quoted £135 to print 60 x 12 page magazines which works out at £2.25 per copy, and we had to collect them!
- By having a digital version we can vary the number of pages to suit our content.

We trust that members will understand that we have considered all aspects, including the fact that we are saving money, paper and transport costs – all of which are very important in these difficult times.

If you, or know of someone, who has received energy savings vouchers to redeem against your bills please be aware that they are only valid for 90 days from the date of issue (not the date they arrive in the post). These vouchers offer vital support for those on lower incomes please use them.

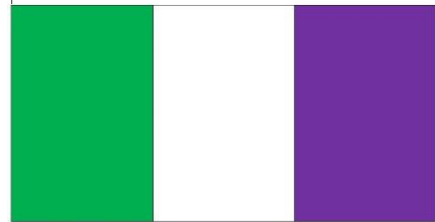

Resolutions: A Road Well-Travelled

We're all familiar with campaign activities that are set in motion once a resolution receives a mandate from the NFWI Annual Meeting, but what happens to older resolutions? After about two years, a comprehensive review starts which leads to one of four possible outcomes:

- The campaign remains a national priority.
- The campaign continues, but with a lower priority.
- The focus alters to perhaps only doing an activity on a particular focused day.
- The campaign winds down, but with a watching brief in case it returns in future.
- It's worth remembering that all campaigns belong to us and we can keep any of them going locally if it is particularly relevant.

Older Resolutions: Can they Still be Relevant Today?

The first resolution was passed in October 1918 – calling for the provision of sufficient supply of convenient and sanitary houses.

In 1943 – Equal Pay for Equal Work. It is now illegal to pay men more than women for work of equal value.

In 1953 – Visiting Children in Hospital. The Covid pandemic has again highlighted how important hospital visiting is to patients of all ages.

In 1974 - Disabled Housewives Pension. Discrepancies in women's pensions are still being uncovered and addressed today.

In 1990 - Fair Trade.

In 2008 - Care not Custody.

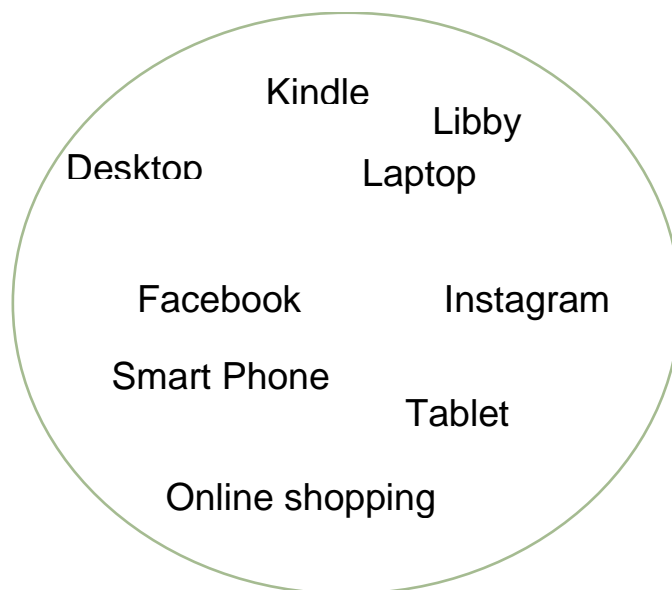
