If you pay sufficient income tax or capital gains tax you can Gift-Aid your subscription. The rules have changed and now gift aid can be claimed at all three levels of the WI. MURIEL FARQUHARSON JENNINGS

17th February 1931 to 30th November 2022



As a number of you may have heard on 30^{th} November 2022 Muriel Farquharson Jennings sadly died. By the early 1990s Muriel had been a member of the WI and involved in the Federation for many years. She had been on the Executive Committee (now known as the Board of Trustees) as Federation Vice Chairman and Treasurer. Muriel had also been a VCO (Voluntary County Officer) which then became a "WI Adviser". In 1976 through her contacts with the city Muriel was involved with the purchase of the WI office in Beer Cart Lane. To everyone's surprise the WI offer of £9,000 was accepted, it having been on the market originally for £18,000! Muriel encouraged the members to raise the purchase money and also money for renovation as the building was very dilapidated.

In her capacity as a WI Adviser she visited most of the WIs in the Federation and many will remember her at their WI's formation.

She returned as a member of the Board in November 2016 and remained a Trustee until her retirement in March 2018.

For many members Muriel was the WI. Her knowledge, generosity and good service were legendary and much appreciated. In Muriel the WI values of Truth, Fellowship, Tolerance and Justice were in evidence at all time. We will truly miss her.

COOKERY CORNER

Moroccan Chickpea, Lentil & Spinach Stew (serves 4 and will freeze)

Something warming and inexpensive for chilly winter days that does not take too long to cook

Ingredients

- 2tbsp olive oil
- 1 onion, diced
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 2cm fresh ginger, peeled and finely chopped
- 1 carrot diced
- ¹/₂ tsp turmeric
- ¹/₂ tsp crushed chilli
- 2 tsp ground cumin

- 2 tsp ground coriander
- 1 cinnamon stick
- 400g chopped tomatoes
- 800ml vegetable stock
- 150g red lentils
- 150g puy or green lentils
- 420g can chickpeas, drained
- 200g fresh baby leaf spinach

Method

- 1. Heat oil in large saucepan, fry onion until begins to brown. Add garlic and ginger, cook further 2 mins
- 2. Add carrot and spices and stir well to coat the vegetables; cook for 2 mins.
- 3. Add tomatoes, stock and lentils. Cook for 30 mins, without a lid, over a moderate heat or until lentils have softened.
- 4. Add chickpeas and heat through.
- 5. When ready to serve remove cinnamon stick, stir through the spinach.
- 6. Serve with brown rice, toasted wholemeal pitta, garlic bread or all 3!!

SHEPHERDSWELL WI

January 2022 was the 100th birthday of our WI. To commemorate our birthday year, we have held a number of celebratory events, produced a scrapbook to preserve our memories of 2022 and researched our history.

The scrapbook that we have produced consists of two halves. The first is a chronological record of the year captured through photos, memorabilia, parish magazine articles and Facebook posts. It not only includes the events and activities carried out to commemorate our 100th birthday, but also a record of our regular monthly meetings, varied programme, subgroups, community contributions and outings. The second half contains profiles of each of our members. It shows what a diverse group of women we are. Our ages range from 51 to 91, with some ladies having been members for more than 45 years. The scrapbook provides a snapshot of today's social history for posterity.

We also decided to research our past WI history. Very little was known of our early years as all of our records from the 1920s and early 30s seem to have been destroyed. With thanks to the Federation Trustees and the staff at the office we were allowed to examine the records they hold. However, there was nothing in the Federation records that wasn't actually in our own records. It was the newspaper archives that gave us information prior to 1934 when our records started.

We have gathered the names of all our presidents. Their backgrounds give an insight into the social history of the time. At first the women were referred to by their husband's name e.g. Joan Smith as Mrs. H. Smith (Henry), and lived in large houses with servants. Many had moved into the area from other parts of Britain – Ireland, Wales, Yorkshire and the Greater London area. Only two, we have found so far, were born and/or lived most of their lives in the Shepherdswell area.

Many members have helped with the history and it has been fascinating to discover the interests and activities of the past, some so different from those today and yet others still being carried on. A fabulous display of WI memorabilia was put together for the Big History Day, a yearly event run by the Shepherdswell & Coldred History Society, and a talk given at this event by one of our members on 100 Years of the WI in Shepherdswell.



We have now come to the end of our 100th birthday year. Much has been achieved but we will continue to try to complete the gaps in our knowledge that remain of the women who have carried this WI through the last 100 years.
